Sixty-one trial trenches, averaging c.30m, were excavated, targeting four areas of archaeological potential revealed by field walking. Fourteen trenches contained mostly post-medieval modern farming practice features, seven contained Roman remains. The total area excavated was 900 sqm. Residual Roman, Neolithic and Iron Age finds were also identified.
