Trench 1 revealed a layer of fired clay with overlying charcoal-rich deposits, which was interpreted as an open hearth or possible floor surface. A layer of cobbles was also revealed which was interpreted as the edge of a Roman road or metalled street, possibly running to the river crossing. [Au(abr)]
