Medieval occupation was represented by a series of isolated pits and stretches of stone wall foundations. Pottery indicated a 13th-14th century date. Post-medieval and modern disturbance was extensive and included large numbers of walls as well as service trenches, rubbish deposits and paved surfaces.
