Geophysical anomalies in a significant part of the study area were dominated by intense magnetisation associated with scatters of brick, tile and iron debris. These deposits were highly concentrated within the moat east and south of Hartbury Court, and beneath ground north of the tithe barn. Elsewhere, geophysical anomalies were found to be remarkably weak. A large pit or well and medieval ridge and furrow were also recorded. [Au(adp)]
