It was thought that prehistoric material may have been present in the study area, perhaps below layers of alluvium. There were 10 identified red hills (Iron Age and Roman saltworking sites) within the study area, likely associated with a nearby settlement site. Archaeological remains from this period to the Second World War were found throughout the environs, and as a result the area was declared one of relatively high potential. [Au(adp)]

The site lay within the Scheduled Ancient Monument of the Roman town of Great Chesterford. The study area had been significantly disturbed by post-medieval activity, including a possible backfilled gravel quarry. A large robber trench followed the line of the Roman town wall. The truncated remains of two Roman pits were identified, as well as a further undated ditch and gully. [Au(abr)]
