The known sites within the study area date from c. 1790 or later, prior to which time the study area was agricultural land. These sites include public baths on Bolton Street, of c. 1794, an adjacent factory originally built c. 1790 as a cotton mill that was converted to the premises of the Caxton Press in 1812 and destroyed by fire in 1821 and the site of the first pumping station of the Liverpool Corporation Water Works Company established in 1800.
