Few prehistoric or Roman sites were detected, none within the study area. In general, the identified archaeological material is of local importance, comprising of medieval through to post-medieval agriculture, parkland and industrial features. The study examined recent land-use of the area and established that it has been subject to extensive landscaping.
