The known archaeological resource was undoubtedly rich, due to its position within the Colne Valley and its extensive evidence of prehistoric settlement. Research was carried out to assist planning proposals in the area. The site was probably the location of a medieval moated manor that was demolished around AD1500. An L-shaped pond at the site was thought to be the remains of the moat. The site had become a landscaped pleasure garden by the early 19th century but most of the buildings were demolished between 1912-1931. [Au(adp)]
