The assessment was carried out in response to proposals for residential development of the site. No prehistoric or Roman remains were seen to be present at the site, which lay outside the medieval settlement of Chipping Sodbury and appeared to be agricultural land until the late post-medieval period. It was believed that a World War II pillbox or gun emplacement was located within the study area. [Au(abr)]

The site was marked for a residential development, and in response this assessment was carried out, along with a building survey and trial excavation programme. The assessment determined that the site was located on the remains of a 20th century foundry. Local tradition considered a nearby feature to be a Roman camp, being located near a Roman Road. However this study and previous excavations have not found any evidence that the earthworks dated before the 13th century. [Au(abr)]
