This context was only partially sealed by a deposit of Romano-British date, and in most places lay directly beneath the topsoil. A single fragment of medieval pottery, dated to the late 12th to early 13th century, was recovered from the topsoil, together with larger quantities of post-medieval and Romano-British finds.
