Seven evaluation trenches were targeted in the area of a 19th century yard, so to avoid 19th century cellaring. Modern dump deposits and 19th century and earlier garden soils were uncovered. Below these deposits, in several of the trenches, evidence was found of a Roman cemetery, with christian graves aligned east to west. An undated ditch was encountered containing Roman and medieval finds. Above this was a path which had early post-medieval pottery in it. A post-medieval brick kiln was also recorded. [Au(abr)]
