Two evaluation trenches were dug on the site prior to construction of new housing. Overall the site produced a prehistoric pit and several postholes believed to be of prehistoric date, sixteen prehistoric potsherds, four struck flints and twenty-five pieces of burnt flint. A number of evaluation trenches were excavated on the site. There were a limited number of widely spaced cut features, post-medieval in date, and a buried soil of a similar date. A stagnant deposit of fine-grained sediment may be the remains of a pond. The report concludes the impact of the proposed redevelopment is relatively slight and the appropriate archaeological response on the area investigated should be an intermittent watching brief.
