Four evaluation trenches were excavated on the site. River terrace deposits had been truncated by quarry pits in the late 19th or 20th century. These pits had been mainly filled with clay containing occasional bricks. A trench revealed at least four shallow bedding trenches. This suggested that at least part of the site was used for market gardening during the 19th or 20th centuries. The only possible evidence for ancient activity on the site consisted of two flints, provisionally identified as waste flakes, which were found on the surface of the river terrace. Evidence for ancient activity on the site was most likely to survive in the southern half of the site. The northern part of the site had been extensively quarried for sand and there the archaeological potential was relatively low. [Au(abr)] *SMR primary record number:* 27/219

The evaluation involved the opening of three, hand-excavated trenches distributed within two basement rooms of the house.
