A peat deposit recorded in trench 1 was radiocarbon dated to the late Bronze Age and appeared to have been truncated by a later fluvial feature, possibly dating to the post-medieval period. [Au]

28 evaluation trenches, which lay within the Scheduled Ancient Monument GL 165, the medieval Cluniac Priory, revealed medieval walls, surfaces and foundation deposits as well as structural elements of the Tudor Mansion house. Walls and deposits from Bermondsey Square's 18th century past were found. Modern activity, including structures and basements, had commonly truncated the archaeology, in places to the level of natural sand and gravel. [Au(abr)]
