The evaluation identified two undated sub-circular enclosures, two post-medieval kilns and a series of undated field boundary ditches, all previously detected by geophysical survey. Other features identified included gullies, pits and postholes forming possible internal features to the two enclosures and a series of additional external boundary ditches and isolated pits. The lack of artefacts from the site prevented dating of the majority of the features. The finds were limited to a single Neolithic flint blade retrieved from the upper fill of an enclosure ditch and post medieval pottery from one of the kilns. [Au(abr)]

The evaluation found that the topsoil was directly underlain by natural sand and gravel. The foundations of a Georgian outbuilding and a Victorian cottage were located but no signs of earlier occupation was identified. It was inferred that the medieval inland port did not extend as far as the site, from the river. Between the late 18th and the 19th century the site was probably the kitchen garden of No. 48 High Street. [Au(adp)]

Red brick structures were exposed and interpreted as being the remains of external buildings and structures associated with the terraced housing erected on the Ellison Street frontage during the late 19th or early 20th century. No evidence for earlier structures was identified during the fieldwork [Au(abr)].

The evaluation confirmed that the immediate area was probably unoccupied before 17th century but during the 18th century buildings were identified as being constructed along the frontage. In the late 18th and 19th centuries plots were laid out and infilled behind the frontage with sheds, workshops and yards. These served artisans who took their lead from the burgeoning steel industry in Sheffield. By 1850 many specific trades are attested and the excavations recovered evidence of bone working and metal working, related to specific buildings on two plots. By the end of that century, the layout was identified as becoming denuded and was swept away during the 20th century. [Au(abr)]
