An archaeological evaluation trench was excavated on the site of the proposed development. Two 14th century wooden drains were identified, cut into natural river clays. A group of timber piles for a possible tieback structure for a revetment was also identified. These features were sealed by post-medieval dump deposits and cellaring. [Au(abr)]

An archaeological evaluation was carried out on the site. Two successive phase of waterfront were identified. The earliest was possibly 16th/17th in date and was constructed from square slabs and robbed brickwork. The second phase was built in the late 17th century and was built of more substantial brick. Behind the clay embankments backfilled deposits containing 19th century finds and residual 17th to 18th century deposits were identified. [Au(abr)]

An evaluation was carried out on the site of the late 17th century fort. Three trenches were excavated on the site and identified the clay ramparts 0.5m below the modern ground surface. The edge of the moat was observed in one trench, together with the remains of a timber revetment. A series of cut features associated with the earlier Henrican defences were also observed. [Au(abr)]
