Foundation trenches cut through disturbed dark soil and into the natural Reading Beds. No significant archaeological deposits were found on Site A. On site B and early, small brick conduit, emerging from under the adjacent 17th century wall, was cut through. It was unclear if it was contemporary with the wall. A brick-lined well of probable 18/19th century date was also found filled with modern rubbish. Both of these features were left intact.[Au] *SMR primary record number:* 17/310

Excavation revealed evidence for a Late Bronze Age droveway bounded by a series of inter-cutting ditches and hedges. A number of pits contained by ditches were filled with a range of finds and organic remains, possibly related to feasting. An undated roundhouse was recorded. A number of pit features, tree throws and subsoil deposits contained Late Bronze Age pottery. Later features include a Romano-British pit as well as Saxon pit, post holes and a ditch.
