The earliest features recorded were of prehistoric date, including a ditch with terminus and two post holes. The ditch was truncated by a sub circular medieval pit which extended beyond the limit of excavation. The nature of this feature and its fills suggested it to have been a watering hole. The excavation covered an open area including the position of the original evaluation trench. The work revealed three phases of drainage ditches running approximately northwest to southwest; two of these had gullies and fencing lines associated. A sequence of pits, post holes and stake holes was also excavated. This represents the drainage of the land for ground reclamation and agricultural use.
