The works exposed a medieval quarry pit, backfilled with domestic and industrial waste, and a 17th or 18th century drain and cellar. They were recorded in plan and section. Ground excavation prior to the insertion of a piling mat was monitored between 20th June and 20th August 2002, during redevelopment of the former properties into new residential use. Archaeological deposits, consisting of an early ploughsoil, tentatively dated to the Roman period, were recorded in section in the northwest of the site. All other areas of the site showed extensive truncation and disturbance caused by construction of the railway to the south and the former properties occupying the site. [Au(adp)]
