Although the overall form and function of this feature remained ambiguous it was probable that this was a corn-drying kiln, associated with the mill and probably dating to the nineteenth century. The pits all appeared late, with those in the south probably post-dating a cobbled surface, which is probably of late nineteenth century date. Although only one dressed sandstone block was observed within the trench, its positioning at the southern end of a secondary area of cobbling suggested that it may have formed the southern wall of a structure. It was not clear from the documentary evidence which building the possible wall may have related to but given its narrow width, it was most probably either an internal wall, or post-medieval in date. The landscape showed evidence of early activity from the Palaeolithic and the Mesolithic through to the Neolithic. The Bronze Age period also yielded evidence of activity as with the Romano-British period. However, the evidence from these periods was not as extensive. No evidence of activity from the Iron Age period had been identified. The post Roman and early medieval periods provided little evidence of activity. However, possible settlement in the Norse period within the study was evident through the remains of enclosures. It was not until the 13th century that documentary evidence for land use was available. [Au(abr)]
