The contractors uncovered 18 stone-built and lined tanks or storage structures used in the brewing process. No remains were located to identify the sites of the Friends Meeting House or its associated burial ground, and only one small section of stone-built wall and one section of 19th century brick wall provided any evidence for the dwellings. In possible association with the stone-built wall to the north was a stone capped culvert that still held running water. Several test pits excavated alongside Montague Street to the south and Alma Street to the north only provided evidence of made-ground and demolition rubble. [Au(abr)]
