A series of overnight raids by treasure hunters had caused severe damage to a section of the Scheduled Roman religious site at Wanborough. As a result a small-scale rescue excavation was undertaken at short notice by the author at the request of English Heritage. This established that the treasure seekers' holes had removed a length of the ambulatory wall of the Romano-Celtic temple, first excavated in 1984/5, and had also damaged associated archaeological levels. Two Celtic silver units, of Epaticcus and Verica respectively, were recovered, indicating that the 'nighthawks' were finding and removing financially valuable artefacts from the site. [Au]
