The excavation was carried out in advance of a new development, and revealed significant layers of medieval settlement activity. The earliest feature was an occupation horizon common across the site and into which subsequent features had been cut. Horizontal beamslots, post holes, a hearth base and the foundations for limestone wall were located, associated with a series of ditches and gullies as boundary markers. Domestic pottery, animal bone, structural metalwork and worked stone objects were also found. A series of post-medieval pits of indeterminate function were noted. [Au(abr)]
