A gradiometer and resistivity survey was carried out on the site. Several features of geotechnical interest may have been mapped by the geophysical survey: these mainly comprise a network of plastic or concrete land drains, and deposits of brick or ferrous debris. A dense concentration may mark the position of a mineshaft infilled with debris. Several linear and curvilinear positive magnetic anomalies in the study area may reflect soil-filled ditches of archaeological interest. [Au(adp)] *SMR primary record number: 2002/6*
